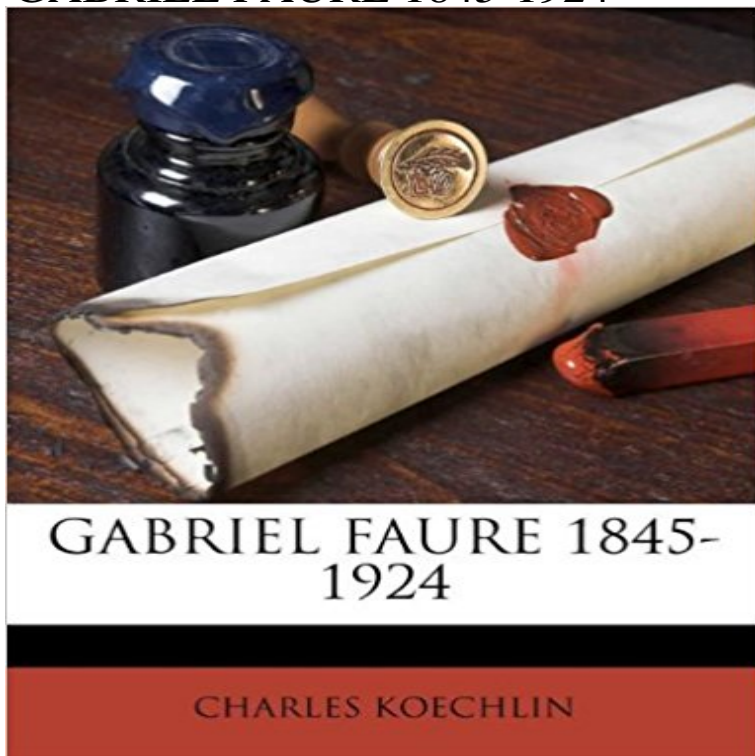


## GABRIEL FAURE 1845-1924
