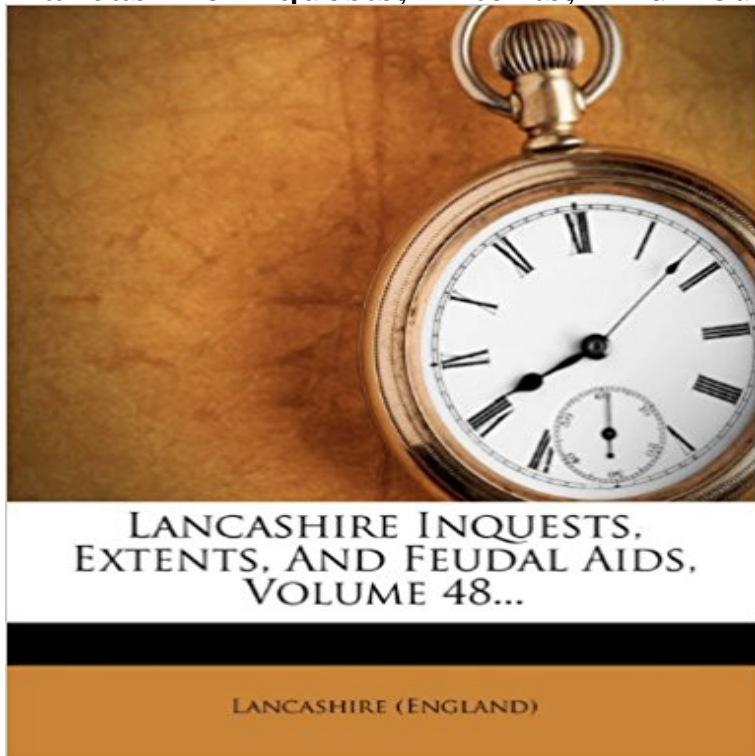


Lancashire Inquests, Extents, And Feudal Aids, Volume 48...
