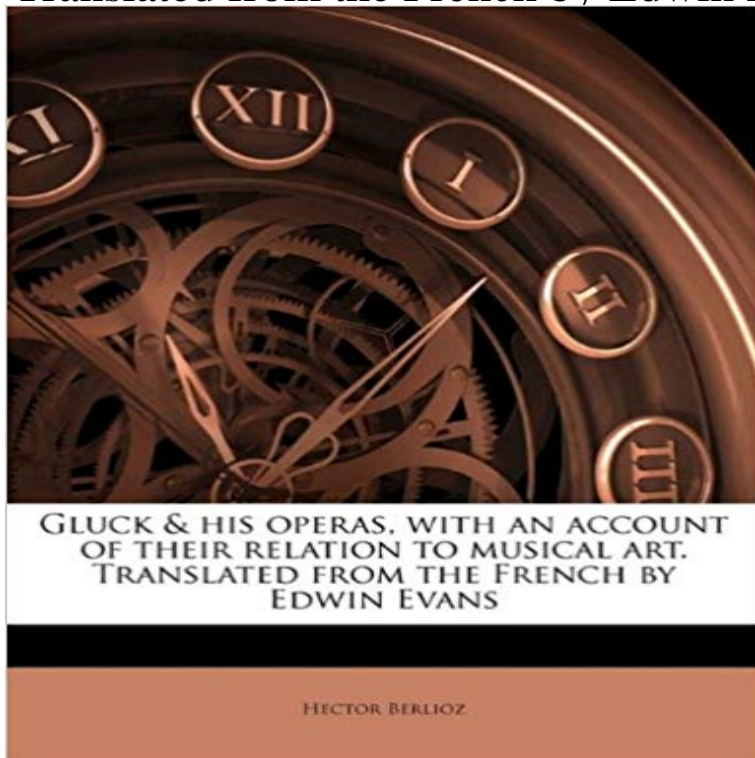


Gluck & his operas, with an account of their relation to musical art. Translated from the French by Edwin Evans
