

Grace Cossington Smith



Grace Cossington Smith is widely considered to be one of Australia's most significant artists. She played a vital role in the development of modernism in Australia. This volume traces her artistic development through paintings and drawings as well as through her many sketchbooks to reveal an artist of considerable depth, insight, and spirituality. It covers her practice from 1910 to 1971, the full span of her career.
