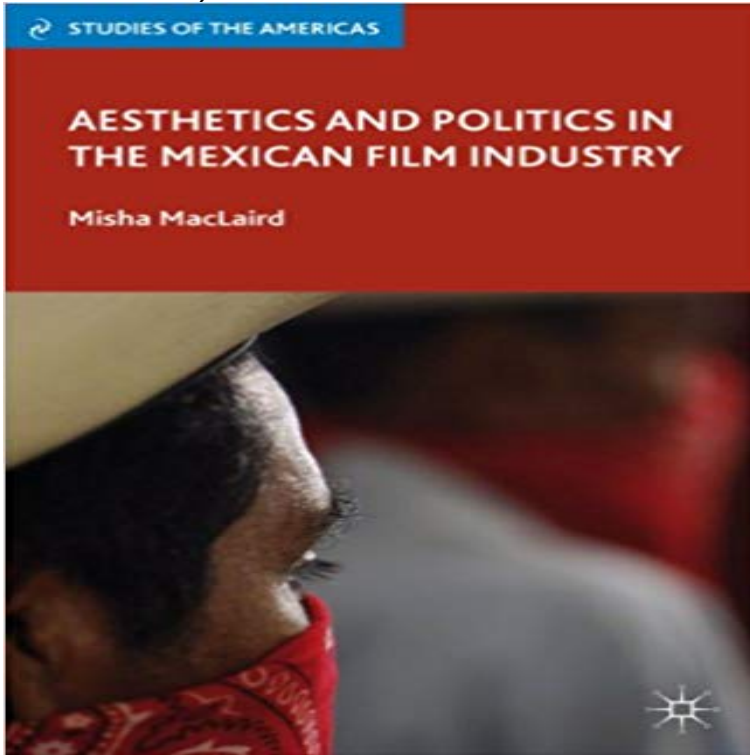


# Aesthetics and Politics in the Mexican Film Industry (Studies of the Americas)
